Colour Accounting helps us be better teachers



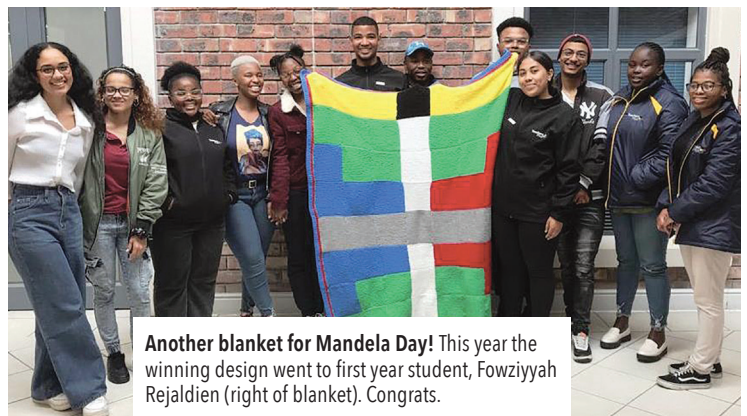
