Once you have an education, it is important your résumé is a clear, concise marketing tool reflecting your skills, experience and accomplishments.

Glynnis Newdigate, our Professional Communications Facilitator, has compiled her top tips



DO

- Use a **professional font**.
- **Pop your contact details at the top** – name, phone number, email address.
- **List your experience, skills and accomplishments** in easy-to-read bullet points starting with the most recent. Focus on what you can do and offer.
- Use **key words from the job ad** in your resumé and covering letter.
- Always **be honest**.
- Make sure your CV is **no more than two pages**. Get someone to help you edit if need be.



DON'T

- Get artistic. **Keep the look clean** by using only one or two font types and sizing.
- **Include personal information that might compromise your security or create bias**. Leave out your faith, age, ethnicity, sexual orientation, health status and marital status.
- **Include skills or interests that don't relate to the job**. The business wants to know if you will meet their needs.
- **Be negative** about any previous experiences. Stay upbeat.
